NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION,

On July 1, 2025, the Public Utilities Commission of Nevada (“Commission”) opened a Rulemaking, designated as Docket No. 25-07007, to amend, adopt, and/or repeal regulations in accordance with Senate Bill 442 (2025) (“SB 442”).

The Commission is conducting the Rulemaking pursuant to the Nevada Revised Statutes (“NRS”) and the Nevada Administrative Code (“NAC”), Chapters 233B, 703 and 704, including, but not limited to, NRS 703.025, 704.210, and SB 442.

The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons on the proposed regulation regarding termination reporting. If no person who is directly affected by the proposed regulation appears at the hearing to request time to make an oral presentation, the Commission may proceed to act upon any written comments.

The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of NRS 233B.0603:

The proposed regulation is needed to make necessary revisions regarding termination reporting for electric, gas, and water/wastewater utilities to conform with the requirements of SB 442.

The proposed regulation is not expected to have adverse immediate or long-term economic effects on the businesses that they are to regulate.

The proposed regulation is not expected to have beneficial immediate or long-term effects on small businesses.

The proposed regulation is expected to have no adverse immediate or long-term economic effects on the public.

The Commission used the simplified Delphi method in determining the impact on small businesses, whereby experts review the text of the proposed regulation and determine the likely impact of the proposed regulation on small businesses. These experts share their responses with each other and form a consensus view. The Commission found that the proposed regulation is neither likely to impose a direct or significant economic burden upon small businesses, nor is it likely to directly restrict the formation, operation, or expansion of a small business.

The proposed regulation should not cause additional cost to the Commission for the enforcement of the proposed regulation.

The proposed regulation does not overlap or duplicate any state or local regulations.

The proposed regulation is not required pursuant to federal law.

The proposed regulation is not more stringent than a federal regulation that regulates the same activity.

The proposed regulation does not establish any new fee or increase an existing fee.

Persons wishing to comment upon the proposed action of the Commission may appear at the scheduled workshop and hearing or may address their comments, data, views, or arguments in written form to the Commission electronically through the electronic filing system on the Commission's website, or at either of the Commission's offices located at 1150 East William Street, Carson City, Nevada 89701 or 9075 West Diablo Drive, Suite 250, Las Vegas, NV 89148 on or before WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 7, 2026. Written comments should include proposed

revisions, if any, to the proposed regulation.

A copy of this notice and the proposed regulation to be adopted, amended, or repealed will be on file at the State Library, 100 North Stewart Street, Carson City, Nevada 89701, for inspection by members of the public during business hours. Additional copies of the notice and the proposed regulations to be adopted, amended, or repealed are on file and available for public viewing at the Commission's website at <https://puc.nv.gov>, and at the offices of the Commission at 1150 East William Street, Carson City, Nevada 89701 or 9075 West Diablo Drive, Suite 250, Las Vegas, NV 89148, for inspection and copying by members of the public during business hours. This notice and the text of the proposed regulation is also available in the State of Nevada Register of Administrative Regulations (File No. R097-26), which is prepared and published monthly by the Legislative Counsel Bureau pursuant to NRS 233B.0653 and on the internet at <https://www.leg.state.nv.us>. Copies of this notice and the proposed regulation will also be mailed to members of the public upon request. A reasonable fee may be charged for copies if it is deemed necessary. This does not apply to a public body subject to the Open Meeting Law.

Upon adoption of any regulation, the Commission, if requested to do so by an interested person, either before adoption or within 30 days thereafter, will issue a concise statement of the principal reasons for and against its adoption or incorporate therein its reason for overruling the consideration urged against its adoption.

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Pursuant to NRS 233B.060(1), the Presiding Officer in this matter anticipates placing the proposed regulations on a Commission Agenda no earlier than November 10, 2026, for the Commission's consideration as to whether to adopt the regulations as temporary.

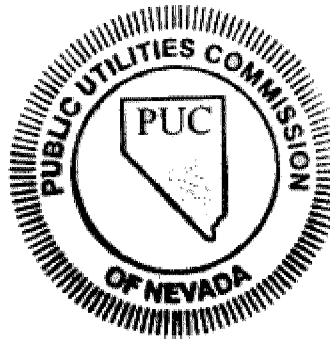

**PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE
PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF NEVADA**

LCB File No. R097-26

May 22, 2026

EXPLANATION – Matter in *italics* is new; matter in brackets ~~[omitted material]~~ is material to be omitted.

AUTHORITY: § 1, NRS 703.025, 704.1835 and 704.210.

A REGULATION relating to public utilities; requiring public utilities to submit to the Commission and make available to the public a report containing information regarding terminations of utility service to residential customers; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires the Public Utilities Commission of Nevada to adopt regulations that require a public utility to make available to the public a report that includes: (1) the total number of monthly terminations of utility service to the residences of residential customers during the previous quarter; and (2) aggregated information concerning the residential customers, including, without limitation, the zip code of the residences where service was terminated. (NRS 704.1835)

This regulation requires public utilities that furnish gas, water or electricity to submit to the Commission and make available to the public a quarterly report that includes: (1) the total number of monthly terminations of utility service to the residences of residential customers based upon nonpayment; and (2) aggregated information concerning such residential customers, including, without limitation, the zip code of the residences where service was terminated. This regulation also authorizes a public utility to include in the report the total number of such terminations for which utility service remained off for more than 48 hours and for which no reconnection of service was scheduled as of the date on which the information for the report was compiled. This regulation also requires the report submitted to the Commission to be verified under oath.

Section 1. Chapter 704 of NAC is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

1. On or before the last day of the first month of each calendar quarter, a public utility which furnishes gas, water or electricity shall submit to the Commission and make available to the public a report, which includes, without limitation:

(a) The total number of monthly terminations of utility service to the residences of residential customers of the public utility during the previous quarter based upon nonpayment, regardless of the length of time such utility service remains off; and

(b) Aggregated information concerning the residential customers described in paragraph (a), including, without limitation, the zip code of such residences.

2. A report submitted to the Commission pursuant to subsection 1 may, in addition to the information required by subsection 1, include, without limitation, the total number of monthly terminations of utility service to the residences of residential customers of the public utility during the previous quarter based upon nonpayment and for which:

(a) Utility service remained off for more than 48 hours; and

(b) No reconnection of service was scheduled as of the date on which the information for the report was compiled.

3. A report submitted to the Commission pursuant to subsection 1:

(a) Must be submitted under oath by the proper officer, agent or person responsible for submitting the report on behalf of the public utility; and

(b) May be submitted on a form made available by the Commission for that purpose.
